

GENERAL SITUATION

Three hours ago, the East Bay had a 7+ earthquake resulting in considerable damage on both sides of the bay. Telephone service is out. The city is 80% without power. Water pressure throughout the city is good.

YOUR SITUATION (1) Member of CARES as Net Control Station

After the first earthquake, you performed the Preliminary Damage Assessment of your neighborhood – everything was ok. You then volunteered to take a shift as Net Control Station at the City EOC. You've been on for about 1 hour.

The EOC is completely staffed, including representatives from County Fire, County Sheriff's office, PG&E, the Cupertino Sanitary district, and San Jose Water. You and the CARES EC are the only members from CARES there... the EC is doing hter running between the EOC and the radio room with traffic to pass.

CARES has several members currently deployed and on the air, either working with organized neighborhoods, in field assignments, or standing by at home. Current on-air members are:

Its been about 30 minutes since the last time you did a health and welfare check of all CARES members.

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YOUR SITUATION (2) Member of CARES on a Field Assignment

After the first earthquake, you performed the Preliminary Damage Assessment of your neighborhood revealing it was essentially ok.

You volunteered to take a shift at a Field Assignment and are now riding in a Cupertino Department of Public Works (DPW) 10 ton truck to support material movement for City agencies. Your job is to pass traffic and relay assignments between the EOC and the driver.

Your tactical call is "TRANSPORT-ONE"

It's been a while since you checked in with NCS.

You just felt the second earthquake and thought the truck was going to roll over. Luckily, it didn't.

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YOUR SITUATION (2) City Employee, Department of Public Works

You were still at work when the first one hit. You were immediately assigned to drive one of those big fancy 10 ton trucks to support material movement for City agencies. Your radio died so they assigned you this guy from CARES to relay assignments between the EOC and you.

You just felt the second earthquake and thought the truck was going to roll over. Luckily, it didn't.

DRILL + 30 MINUTES

You come across a telephone utility truck in front of a downed telephone pole and lots of broken branches that are completely blocking all lanes at Stelling by McClellan. Wires are all over the place... what a mess. You stop and the PacBell guy says it will be this way for hours because no other crews are available. He asks if Cupertino DPW could help? Tell the CARES guy to call it in... this could be a problem for emergency vehicles.

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YOUR SITUATION (3) Member of CARES on a Field Assignment

After the first earthquake, you performed the Preliminary Damage Assessment of your neighborhood revealing it was essentially ok.

You then volunteered to take a shift at a Field Assignment and were assigned to the Cupertino Medical Center on Stevens Creek Blvd. When you arrived at the center, you checked in with the Center's Medical Emergency Coordinator and identified yourself as a member of CARES and an emergency communicator. You have been there for 30 minutes. Another CARES member shows up and you decide that you will cover the City CARES Net, s/he will cover the County Hospital Net.

Your tactical call is "CUPERTINO-MEDICAL"

You just felt the second earthquake and it felt bigger than the first one. You think this place could get real busy,, it does. New patients are coming in... their injuries look serious.

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YOUR SITUATION (3) Medical Admin Manager, Cupertino Medical Center

You were still at work when the first one hit. A quick survey of the facility indicated it didn't sustain any real damage and the center is still in operation. You were assigned to be the Medical Emergency coordinator responsible for coordinating all emergency medical activities for the center. The phones are out, but that's ok... Two members of CARES showed up 30 minutes ago.

The situation is this...

- Staffing: 3 doctors and 4 nurses on duty, 5 medical assistants present
- Damage Assessment. The center has sustained minor damage, but has been cleaned up. All telephones are still out.
- Patient Mix: 40 walk-ins per hour. The bulk of the injuries are minor, some serious injuries, the wait is getting longer.

You just felt the second earthquake and it felt bigger than the first one. This job could get difficult.

DRILL + 60 MINUTES

Dr Congress just asked you to call for assistance to evacuate several patients with serious injuries to other facilities. He has 3 patients with compound fractures and 1 person who is unconscious due to of head injuries. Tell the CARES radio operator to pass this request on.

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YOUR SITUATION (4) Member of CARES on a Field Assignment

After the first earthquake, you performed the Preliminary Damage Assessment of your neighborhood revealing it was essentially ok.

You volunteered to take a shift at a Field Assignment and were assigned to the Emergency Red Cross Shelter set up at Homestead High School. You just arrived about 50 minutes ago. Its not too crowded and think this is going to be an easy assignment.

Your tactical call is "HOMESTEAD SHELTER"

You just felt the second earthquake and it felt bigger than the first one. You think this place could get real busy.

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YOUR SITUATION (4) Shelter Manager, Homestead High School

You are a local shop owner and certified as a Red Cross Shelter Manager. You got the go-ahead to open the shelter about 2 hours ago. On opening the shelter, they were surprised at the number of people seeking help. 75 individuals checked in so far. Detailed interviews are now in progress. You begin to think that you may need more supplies if it gets busier than this.

You just felt the second earthquake and it felt bigger than the first one. This job could get difficult.

DRILL + 50 MINUTES

You conclude you need more supplies from the Red Cross storage facility in downtown San Jose (12345 North First Street, San Jose). One of your assistance completed an inventory and this is what you need:

- 200 cots and blankets
- 75 medical responder kits
- 125 sanitary kits
- 500 lbs of canned food goods

The phones are still out. Tell the CARES radio operator to see the city can send a truck to pick up these items.

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YOUR SITUATION (5) Member of CARES on a Field Assignment

After the first earthquake, you performed the Preliminary Damage Assessment of your neighborhood revealing it was essentially ok.

You volunteered to take a shift at a Field Assignment and were assigned to the a First Aid Station set up at the Monta Vista Fire Station. You have been there for about 30 minutes.

Your tactical call is "Monta Vista First Aid"

This station was established about 1-1/2 hours ago by a nearby-organized neighborhood First Aid Team consisting of a Registered Nurse and two individuals with a Red Cross First Aid Certification. They had plenty of first aid supplies and set up the first aid station on the Fire Station's tarmac (with their permission) to offer first aid to anyone in the surrounding neighborhood. People have been stopping by for about an hour, most with minor scrapes and injuries. They are all shaken, but appreciative.

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YOUR SITUATION (5) First Aid Team Captain, now at the Monta Vista Fire Station

You are the First Aid Team Lead for a nearby organized neighborhood. Because your neighborhood was spared and you had plenty of first aid supplies, you requested and received permission from the Fire Department to establish a temporary First Aid Station on the Fire House's tarmac. The First Aid Team consists of yourself, a Registered Nurse and another individual with a Red Cross First Aid Certification. People have been stopping by for about an hour, most with minor scrapes and injuries, about 45 treated so far.. They are all shaken, but appreciative. A CARES member with a radio showed up and is available for your use.

You just felt the second earthquake and it felt bigger than the first one. This job could get difficult.

DRILL + 75 MINUTES

More people are coming by and are beginning to overwhelm the three folks there. You could use more help. Request that CARES call in and determine if there are any other First Aid volunteers that could help out. If we can get 3 more First Aid trained individuals, that would help.

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YOUR SITUATION (6) Member of CARES on a Field Assignment

After the first earthquake, you performed the Preliminary Damage Assessment of your neighborhood revealing it was essentially ok.

You volunteered to take a shift at a Field Assignment and were assigned to be the Shadow communicator for the City's Emergency Volunteer Coordinator at Quinlan Center. You have been there for about 30 minutes.

Your tactical call is "Volunteer Shadow"

You just felt the second earthquake and it felt bigger than the first one. You think this place could get real busy.

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YOUR SITUATION (6) City Employee, Parks and Recreation, Quinlan Center

After the first earthquake, you assumed the role of Emergency Volunteer Coordinator and you have been collecting names of people who walk in and want to help out. You then assign them as requests come in. So far, the list looks like this.

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YOUR SITUATION (7) Member of CARES in an Organized Neighborhood

You are part of an organized neighborhood that has been responding since the first earthquake hit 3 hours ago. You were helping a damage control team when the second aftershock struck. It actually felt stronger than the first.

After it stopped, the neighborhood captain sent out the damage assessment teams again. You discover one house on fire at 11342 Riverside; it is almost fully engulfed and is throwing off plenty of sparks. It looks like a gas leak rupture. Two other houses are threatened. All phones in the neighborhood are still out.

Elsewhere, 5 houses have cracked chimneys, about 10 with broken windows. The Medical Committee reports only minor injuries; there are no access problems for your neighborhood. Other than the houses on fire, no other assistance needed. 20 homes surveyed.

DRILL + 10 MINUTES

You have just completed your Preliminary Damage Assessment.

DRILL + 25 MINUTES

A second house is now on fire at 11352 Riverside, next to the first house. Neighbors are trying to put water on it with garden hoses. One fire truck is now entering the street.

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YOUR SITUATION (8) Member of CARES in an Organized Neighborhood

You are part of an organized neighborhood that has been responding since the first earthquake hit 3 hours ago. You were helping with the neighborhood medical committee when the second aftershock struck. It actually felt stronger than the first.

After it stops, the neighborhood captain sends out the damage assessment teams again. You discover 4 houses that have slipped off their foundations, 2 with collapsed garages. A man, trapped in one of the garages at 342 Mann Drive, has been freed, but is bleeding severely from the leg. The First Aid Team is trying to stabilize him. He is unconscious and appears to be going into shock. They tell you they need to get him a hospital.

Elsewhere, about 20 have broken windows. Some folks have cuts on the hands and face, but nothing serious. A road section has buckled, but is passable. 43 homes were surveyed.

DRILL + 15 MINUTES

You have just completed your Preliminary Damage Assessment.

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YOUR SITUATION (9) Member of CARES at home

You have been home monitoring the CARES net since it was activated when the second aftershock struck. It actually felt stronger than the first.

After picking yourself up off the floor, you look outside and see the following:

A small child is sitting in front of a house, crying. You also see water streaming from under a garage door into the street. At the end of the street, a retaining wall holding back a moderate sized hill has collapsed with dirt, rocks, and wall debris sliding into the street. The street appears to be marginally passable. People are beginning to come out of their houses. There doesn't appear to be any injuries in your neighborhood. All other conditions appear to be normal.

DRILL + 45 MINUTES

You have just completed your Preliminary Damage Assessment.

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YOUR SITUATION (10) Member of CARES at home

You have been home monitoring the CARES net since it was activated when the second aftershock struck. It actually felt stronger than the first.

After picking yourself up off the floor, you look outside and see the following:

You see no visible damage to the houses immediately across the street from you. At a house further down the street, an older woman is outside her front door waving frantically and screaming for assistance... something about calling 911 and an ambulance. Elsewhere, you see that about 20 feet of the curbs have buckled. Two houses on your side of the street look like they slipped off their foundation. Two other houses appear to have broken windows. People are beginning to come out of their houses; some look confused, but are calm. There is no water in the street. All other conditions appear to be normal.

DRILL + 40 MINUTES

You have just completed your Preliminary Damage Assessment.
