Practical & Tactical Best-Practices

- Learnings based on AAR, past events, County standards, not an expert, interactive
- Practical skills that apply to all of EmComm and not just the BB5K
- The "how things are best done"
- Refined skills → increased efficiency → max effectiveness
- EmComm = Emergency Communications
- Time is of the essence, especially under stress
- Exercise our "muscle memories" regularly
- The fun parts of what we do



New Participant Orientation Topics

- Simulation of moving large quantities of people
- Last year's BB5K went well, even with the threat of rain

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- Multiple groups of volunteers
- Dual nets (HAM & GMRS)



Resource Net

- Self-announce travel if net hasn't opened yet
- When in car ready to depart
- First inform NC of *why* you're contacting them
 - "Net control, N6TAE ready to depart"
- Give: destination, major cross streets, odometer (tree, fife, niner)
- Upon arrival, stay in car, use external antenna and contact NC with arrival location and odometer
 - "Net control, I have arrived at Wilson Park, odometer tree, six, niner, N6TAE"



Before Departure From ICP to Checkpoint

- Use High power
- Use tactical call and say:
 - "Net control, checkpoint 12 departing the ICP for my position, N6TAE"
- Radio check
- Check loudness for both your RX and TX



Health & Welfare Checks

- Quick & efficient
- NC will pre-announce a H&W check so be prepared
 - "Checkpoint 3, N6TAE"
- NC will re-try anyone who didn't answer after the first pass
- Always end all transmission exchanges with your call to remain FCC compliant
- To help us all stay compliant, NC will pass it back to you if you forget



Breaking In With Priority Traffic

- We are communicators and the "eyes and ears" so...
- If you see something (significant), say something
 - Someone fell
 - Someone looks like they need help
 - Misbehavior with drivers, such as moving a barricade or interacting with runners
- A roaming motorcycle deputy can respond
- If something is urgent, say "break, break, break with priority traffic, checkpoint 3"



Handling an Open Mic

- These can quickly escalate to something really bad so act immediately
- NC will announce with high power an open mic situation
- Everyone should double check your radio & speaker mic that nothing's come loose
- Can happen even without a speaker mic
- It might have been you if...
 - You didn't hear the *doubled* NC announcement
 - You hear only the courtesy tone(s), then an announcement
- Yaesu FT-60s must be inspected by IC for presence of rubber band on plug
- Don't be "that guy/gal" with an open mic



Lost Person Reporting

- Break in if you have to with "break, break, break, priority traffic, checkpoint 12," then wait for NC
- State clearly WHAT you're reporting
 - Someone looking FOR a lost person is different than someone who IS a lost person
 - Full physical description (height, hair color, clothes colors for top & bottom, shoes)
 - Location last seen, direction headed if possible
- Write down what you're hearing
- NC will repeat what was reported



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Visualization Of Audio Level Differences



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Maximize Your Transmissions

- A weak signal is bad enough, but add low audio level to the transmission and it's much harder to copy for a busy NC who may be in a loud environment
- Weak signal and/or low audio level slows the net down
- Check if you're in a weak spot & use High power
- Try to avoid a request for a repeat
- Find your signal's "sweet spot" & keep antenna vertical
- Talk close enough to your mic to be loud enough (typically 3-4" away)
- Avoid signal-deflecting obstructions (ie: 2-story house, large vehicles)
- Have antenna between you and the repeater (Northwest of where we'll be)
